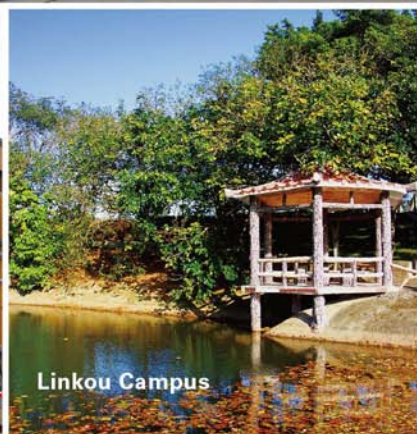

- ◆ Founded in 1946.
- ◆ 3 Campuses: Main Campus and GongGuan campus are located in the heart of Taipei city, and the LinKou campus is located in New Taipei City.
- ◆ 10 Colleges: Arts, Education, International Studies and Education for Overseas Chinese, Liberal Arts, Management, Music, Science, Social Sciences, Sports and Recreation, and Technology.

- ◆ In 2011 NTNU ranked 201st in the category of Arts & Humanities of the QS World University Rankings. NTNU was also ranked among the 101 to 150 top schools in the sub-category of Language Studies and among the 150 to 200 top schools in the sub-category of English Studies.



- ◆ In its World University Online Ranking, Spain's Centre for Scientific Information and Documentation has NTNU ranked 176th in the world, 17th in Asia, and 6th in Taiwan.
